- Must have at least 10 years of senior level business, management, consultant, or policy-making experience
- Proficiency in oral and written English
- · Must have an accepted research concept note or proposal

- 2. Qualified applicants will undergo an admissions interview with the program faculty

- 4. Research Concept Note must be presented to a panel composed of program faculty and your potential supervisor.*
- 5. Admissions result will be sent via dba@aim.edu
- 6. To enroll, reserve a slot by paying a USD1,000 registration fee which will be deducted from the total program fee.
